Five pages, with diagrams, is given on the variable stars Sagittae, in which many authorities are cited, by M. Luizert, meteorologist at the observatory at Lyons. There are many short notes, including a view, with illustration, of Mars on May 4 of this year, a stereoscopic photograph of the suu on the 25th of March, 1906, showing two large spots, the heighth of meteors, radioactive matter in the sun, international congress for solar studies, annals of the Athens Observatory, etc. An eight page article on the surface markings of Jupiter, nicely illustrated, concludes the number.
